#### Materials:

- 14" x 14" black homespun
- lightweight fusible web
- Wools: 4½" x 10" white for scallops
   11" x 11" tan for background
   5" x 8½" brown for fence, letters, and corners
   4½" x 5" green for hollyhock leaves
   1½" x 1½" light green for small leaves
   2½" x 3" red for flowers and 6 cents
   2½" x 3" yellow for flowers
   2" x 2½" pink for flowers
- Embroidery floss or size 12 pearl cottons to coordinate with wools, plus black
- Air erasable fabric marker (optional)
- Buttons: ten ¼" cream rounds five ½" red flowers two ¾" bees

Use three strands of dark green and a chain stitch to embroider the tall Stems: You may free-hand these or use a fabric pen (the disappearing purple pen works great for this) to draw your

Blanket stitch around all the leaves The Leaves: Iron the leaves and the little seed pods at the top of the stems onto the block next. You may use the
